Out this week is a Tom Clancy thriller by Mike Maden called *Firing Point*. This book is number six in the Jack Ryan, Jr. series. Jack Ryan, Jr. is relaxing in a Barcelona café on vacation when he unexpectedly runs into an old friend. Rene Moore is at first surprised to see Ryan, but soon becomes irritable and distracted. The two makes plans to meet up later and Ryan walks away. When a suicide bomber destroys the café he had only just been in, Ryan races back looking for his friend. He is able to

find her and she manages to speak a single word to him before she dies. This word and the sudden loss of his friend sends him on a journey to find the culprits.

Joyce Carol Oates' new novel *Night. Sleep. Death. the Stars.* is about a family who has recently lost their powerful patriarch. At the sudden loss of their authoritative parent, each of the adult children reacts in different and sometimes disturbing ways. Their mother's reaction is even more surprising. As this family grapples with their loss, they are forced to deal with pent up trauma, grief and eventually healing.
