The entrepreneurs purchased the restaurant, at 1211 Cottonwood in Bandera, from George Carey this summer and officially reopened Oct. 1. Their hours are Tuesday through Saturday, from 11 am. to 3 p.m.

Menu items range from sandwiches and burgers to egg rolls. All meals, such as The Guido - salami, pepperoni, ham, pastrami and cheese with Italian relish; The Sparkles - roasted chicken, pecans, cranberries, celery and spring mix; The Josh - pork/beef chili, shredded cheese, red onion and Fritos on an Angus beef burger; and The Moby - fried flounder, bacon, cheese, tomato and spring mix, include free chips and a drink, and may be turned into a salad on request at no extra charge. Dine-in meals also include a free bowl of soup, and to-go soups are available to purchase.
