New market comes to Lakehills

The newest enterprise to arrive in Lakehills is the Last Saturday Market. The brainchild of Jeremy and Lacey Salois, it will bring together local and Hill Country vendors every month to provide opportunities for sellers to sell and buyers to buy while also providing live entertainment and food for visitors.

It is scheduled for the last Saturday of every month, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., rain or shine, at the Lakehills Civic Center, 11225 PR, in Lakehills. The first market day will be March 27.

There is room for 80 vendors and more than two dozen have already signed up. More artists, artisans, craftsmen and hand crafters are invited, as well as sellers of foods and fresh produce. Applications can be found online at [lakehillssaturdaymarket.com](http://lakehillssaturdaymarket.com).

“We hope to pull from our wonderful area as much as possible and really highlight what our county has to offer in the line of craftsmanship,” Jeremy Salois said.

So far, local vendors include locally produced honey, Hill Country wine and wine tasting, sweets, hunting and fishing wear and gear, leather goods, homemade soaps and lotions, cosmetics, clothing and accessories, lavender products, candles and pottery.

In addition, Santa Cruz BBQ will be there with a full menu to provide meals for the hungry visitors.

This month the entertainment will be provided by our very own popular local band, Rebel Roxy, who will play from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Each month will feature different entertainers.

While admission to the event is free, there will be a \$5 donation for parking. Half of the parking amount will go to the Lakehills Civic Center and half will go to a local charity.

The Saloises own Hill Country Homemades - soap and lotion vendors. Before they had kids, they traveled to markets in the Hill Country every weekend. That slowed down with the raising of their children. Two-and-a-half years ago, when the youngsters grew up and left home, the Saloises went “full time” again. They observed there are no big markets in Lakehills and they wanted to change that.

They signed a six month contract with the Lakehills Civic Center, with the idea of making it permanent. Realizing there are a lot of talented and gifted people in the county, they hope to give them an opportunity to sell their goods. They advertise in San Antonio and in the other markets over the Hill Country.

They assure the public that they will be Covid compliant, adhering to the guidelines set by Region 8 and the county judge. They set up the vendors 10 feet apart and ask them to wear masks and provide hand sanitizer. Although they cannot require visitors to wear masks, they encourage social distancing.
