FLAG DAY, June 14, is the anniversary of the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the official U.S. flag in 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that established June 14 as Flag Day. It is not an official federal holiday.
