Rodeo

The Riding on Faith Rodeo series will return to Mansfield Park, after last week's rainout, this Friday, July 16, and in addition to the regular events, this will be a national qualifier for the

Hooey Junior Patriot, the World's Richest Youth Rodeo. Bullriders, aged 19 and under, are eligible to qualify for the big show in Ft. Worth, so there might be quite a few more entrants than usual. The Junior Patriot paid out \$1,039,296.00 in last year's rodeo and this year's event should be even larger.

As always, gates open at 6 p.m. with Barrels starting at 7 p.m. and the rodeo at 8 p.m.

The 5 Minute Ranch Rodeo Challenge will take place at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, July 24 at Mansfield Park Arena.

The event, presented by the Ridin' the River Cowboy Fellowship Arena Ministry, will feature teams of four, one of which must be a youth under 16 or a female, competing in timed events that are everyday ranch doings, The top six teams in the first round will advance to the finals.
