Smith has studied drawing and painting all over the country. Her work has been accepted into many juried art shows and won numerous awards. In 2000, her painting won first prize in the American Printing House for the Blind's art competition in Louisville, Ky. All of her works on display are for sale with a portion of the sale benefitting the library.
