The District 28 4A cross-country meet was held in Fredericksburg on Thursday.

Bandera's Braden Cox outpaced the field by almost 11 seconds to take individual gold and help lead Bandera to a second-place finish as a team in the seven-team field.

The Bulldogs had six runners finish in the top half of the field of 48 runners in the 5K event as they fought off third place Boerne to advance to regional competition that takes place Monday, Oct. 24 at TAMU-CC.

At the regional meet, the top four teams and any top 10 finishers not on a top four team will advance to the state meet.
